Emil came to the Wishkah in 1912 and bought the property now known as the Hannick place. He would walk to town and buy a wagonload of groceries for \$10.00 and the grocer would haul it home for him. He worked for the Donovan Corkery and Greenwood Logging Companies. He sold his place to Hannick and moved in with Lehtinens. He married and had a child. Later, when he and Theresa married, they lived with her parents until he could build a house on the property. The house is still standing. His in-laws lived in a home behind the current George Gilliland house. In 1948 the Dianovich family moved to North River.

Lived on the Wishkah Road across from the church. The old house once used by Gilliland's was the original structure built by Emil.

1st wife died in Yugoslavia during childbirth, divorced from 2nd wife (she was a relative to the Busch plumbing people, had a son, Joe)

Emil b. Dec. 18, 1881-d. Jan. 15, 1975 buried St. John's Cemetery Emil was born in Yugoslavia.

Theresa b. Nov. 10, 1903-d. Sept. 30, 1992 buried St. John's Cemetery Theresa was born in Madison, Wisconsin. D/o Steven/Catherine (?) Szczepanski (pronounced Shapansky)
