Seattle - James E. Dineen, 54, a resident of the Wishkah Valley, died Saturday, April 29, 1995, at the University of Washington hospital in Seattle. He was born in Aberdeen, Nov. 7, 1940, the son of Helena (Haavisto) Dineen and Don Dineen, Sr. He graduated from Aberdeen High School in 1958 and then from Grays Harbor College with a degree in electronics. He worked in the family business, Dineen Shake and Shingle and had also worked for Comery's Electronics, Cox Cablevision, McCaw Cable, Cooke Cablevision and at the time of his death was the microwave engineer for TCI Cablevision. He was a ham radio operator, operated radio controlled boats and airplanes and enjoyed traveling in the family's recreational vehicle.

He liked machine tooling and cars and was a member of the Push Rod Car Club, the National Rifle Association, the Aberdeen Pioneer Association and the Washington State Cable Communicators Association. He married Frances L. Baretich at Lake Quinault Lodge in 1974. She survives at the family home.

Other survivors include a son, Greg J. of Aberdeen, a daughter, Ann M. Szolas of the Wishkah Valley; two brothers, Ted of Hoquiam and Don Jr. of Montesano; and his mother Helena Dineen of Aberdeen. His father died before him.

Visitation will be at the Fern Hill Funeral home from 3-5 p.m. on Wednesday, May 3 and from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. Thursday on May 4. A graveside service will be held at 11 a.m. Friday in St. John's Cemetery in the Wishkah Valley.
