JOSEPH JOHN DUDRA

Joseph John Dudra, a resident of Aberdeen for 58 years, died Sunday, July 13, 2003 at Valley Medical Center in Renton. He was 88. Mr. Dudra was born April 18, 1915 in Ironwood, Michigan to Louis and Mary (Simo) Dudra. He moved to Aberdeen in 1945. He had been married to Estelle (Teclaw) for over 25 years. She survives him at the family home in Aberdeen. He served in the U.S. Army during WWII at an infantry rifleman and received three bronze battle stars in the Asian Pacific Theater. He also fought in the East Indies and New Guinea campaigns. Mr. Dudra retired after working for 32 years in Mills on the Harbor.

He was a member of the Hoquiam V.F.W. and the Hoquiam Eagles for over 50 years. He enjoyed fishing, hunting and working on his tree farm located in Aberdeen.

In addition to his wife, Mr. Dudra is survived by his stepdaughter, Sharon Sherman of Aberdeen, stepson, Harry Larson of Kent; brothers, Bernard and Tony Novobielski both of Yakima; sisters, Rose Rosenberger and Josephine Cox both of Yakima; numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren. A funeral service will be held at Whiteside Family Mortuary in Aberdeen on Thursday, July 17, 2003 at 10:30 a.m. The graveside service will follow at the Wishkah Cemetery.
